Access to a followup learning cohort for one year. Two follow-up personal or team coaching sessions.

How we'll meet?

We'll use a format called [The Art of Hosting](#). It is a participative approach for leading, convening, and engaging. It is big enough to hold big questions in healthcare, high stakes, and heavy energy. Specific enough to generate new actionable ideas. Now practiced world wide, it is a pattern of learning, strengthening relationships, and getting to work. No, it's not presentations. You'll be required to think and engage. We'll meet in raw and courageous honesty.
